




CE-Spaces4All

Memorandum of Understanding



Final version October 2025











1. Introduction

The Spaces4All project aims to strengthen cooperation among organisations operating in rural border regions of Central Europe to promote the development of accessible tourism.

The project partners work together to ensure that the principle of equal access is reflected at every level of territorial planning, tourism services, and decision-making — enabling persons with disabilities to participate equally in society and in tourism activities.

Within the framework of the project, the **Joint Strategy** provides guidance for achieving inclusive, sustainable, and competitive tourism, supporting long-term territorial planning and cooperation for accessibility.

2. Framework of cooperation

By signing this Memorandum, the **Spaces4All project partners (PPs)** and **selected associated partners (APs)** express their shared intention to uphold and disseminate the principles and recommendations of the **Joint Strategy** beyond the project's lifetime. In line with the Application Form, only selected associated partners are required to sign this document.

The parties reaffirm their commitment to promoting accessibility, inclusion, and equal opportunities, and to strengthening inclusive approaches in tourism, territorial planning, and local development.

3. Commitments

The partners commit to:

- supporting the development of accessible and inclusive tourism, and maintaining the partnership network established for this purpose;
- integrating the principles of the Joint Strategy into their own development, planning, and decision-making processes;
- facilitating the exchange of experiences, data, and good practices among the participating organisations and regions;
- **continuing capacity-building and knowledge-sharing activities** related to inclusive and accessible tourism;
- promoting data-driven and evidence-based planning and decision-making,
 including the use of digital and GIS-based tools to enhance accessibility;
- jointly exploring future opportunities for cooperation, research, and funding to further advance accessible tourism;
- contributing to broad communication and dissemination of the project's results, and to raising public awareness on the importance of inclusive tourism.







The partners declare that their cooperation is based on mutual trust, partnership, and openness, and that preserving and further developing the results of their joint work is in their common interest.

4. Signature

The parties acknowledge that the signing of this Memorandum does not constitute a legally binding agreement but rather expresses their **shared intent and commitment** to the long-term preservation and utilisation of the project's results, as well as to the continued **promotion of accessible and inclusive tourism**.

By signing this document, the **Spaces4All project partners and associated partners** reaffirm their willingness to continue joint efforts and cooperation even after the project's completion, with the common goal of advancing inclusive tourism in Central Europe.
